Dr. Dennis W. Rowe is a Principal Engineer at The MITRE Corporation's Center for Advanced Aviation System Development. In this capacity, he shaped the direction of several major Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) programs. His research in new airspace designs and concepts has played an important role in the evolution of the US Air Traffic Control System.

After the West Point Diversity Leadership Conference in 2005, Dr. Rowe organized an ACT/SAT Score Improvement Team of West Point graduates, and some non-graduates, to help diverse candidates improve their ACT and SAT test scores. As a direct result of Dr. Rowe's leadership, his team has assisted hundreds of diverse candidates achieve qualifying scores to attend West Point and the West Point Prep School. Many of these candidates have already graduated from the Academy and are now serving on active duty throughout the world.!

Dr. Rowe is a recipient of the National Black Engineer of the Year Award for Professional Achievement in Industry, and the Union League of Philadelphia's "first ever" Alumni Achievement Award.

Dr. Rowe holds a Bachelor's degree in Engineering from the United States Military Academy at West Point. He earned a Master of Science degree in Engineering (Computer Science) from The George Washington University, and a Master of Education degree (Counseling) from Boston University.
