ACADEMY PROFESSORS IN THE DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH AND PHILOSOPHY. This search seeks to fill two positions: one in literature and one in philosophy. Principal responsibilities will include academic leadership, teaching, and scholarship. Specific duties will include: teaching undergraduate courses in composition, literature, or philosophy; supervision of faculty and academic programs; curriculum development; faculty development; service on faculty committees; and research. In the application, candidates should specify whether they are competing for one type of appointment or for both. Applicants for the above positions should have a demonstrated capacity for further academic achievement and scholarship. Dedication to excellence in teaching is an absolute requirement. The officers selected should have previous professional teaching experience at the college or university level. Candidates should also hold a Ph.D. degree in the appropriate specialty or have a master's degree and be able to obtain a Ph.D. within three years of appointment. ACADEMY PROFESSOR IN THE DEPARTMENT OF GEOGRAPHY AND ENVIRONMENTAL ENGINEERING. This position will reside within the Geospatial Information Science program in the Department of Geography and Environmental Engineering. The preferred applicant is an individual with a broad background in the geospatial information science discipline. The principal responsibilities for this position include military and academic leadership, faculty development, service to the Academy, teaching, and scholarship in the field of geospatial information science. Specific duties include supervising and developing junior faculty; teaching undergraduate courses in geospatial information science; mentoring cadets; curriculum development; outreach to governmental and non-governmental organizations; service on USMA committees; and academic research. Dedication to junior faculty development, excellence in teaching, and a strong commitment to the educational, military, physical, and ethical development of cadets are essential requirements of this position. Operational deployment experience is preferred. Applicants should possess an earned Ph.D. in spatial information science and engineering, geodetic science, geomatics, geography or a related discipline at the time of appointment; or be capable of completing a doctoral degree in one of the listed disciplines within three years of selection. Dedication to excellence in teaching is an absolute requirement of this position. The officer selected for this position should have previous college-level teaching experience. Candidates should hold a Ph.D. degree in physics, nuclear engineering, or a closely related field, or they should hold a master's degree and be able to obtain a Ph.D. within three years of appointment. Applicants must have a strong commitment to the educational, military, physical, social, and ethical development of cadets.
