PROFESSOR, USMA AND DEUPTY HEAD IN THE DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SCIENCE. The United States Military Academy is accepting applications for Professor, USMA in the Department of Social Sciences. All applicants should have a demonstrated high capacity for further academic achievement and scholarship. Principal responsibilities of the positions include academic leadership, teaching, scholarship, and administration. Specific duties include teaching undergraduate courses in political science, economics and/or public policy; supervision of faculty and academic programs; curriculum development, faculty development, service on faculty committees, and research. Supervision of the Department's Centers of Excellence (Office of Economic and Manpower Analysis and the Combating Terrorism Center) may be included in responsibilities. Dedication to excellence in teaching is an absolute requirement for these positions. Candidates should have previous college-level or professional teaching experience. In addition, they must hold a Ph.D. in political science, public policy, or economics, or hold an M.A., M.P.A., M.P.P., M.B.A. degree and be able to obtain a Ph.D. within three years of appointment. Applicants must have a strong commitment to the educational, military, physical and ethical development of cadets. PROFESSOR, USMA AND DEPUTY HEAD IN THE DEPARTMENT OF SYSTEMS ENGINEERING. The officer selected and appointed Professor, USMA will be responsible for planning undergraduate instruction in Systems Engineering, Engineering Management, and Systems Management. The Deputy Head is responsible for directing department administration; overseeing financial and physical resources; overseeing the departmental research program; teaching cadets; and assisting the Department Head in the professional development of military and civilian faculty and staff, and overall leadership of the Department. The officer selected will also provide leadership in governance activities of the Military Academy and engage in outreach activities with Department of Defense clients and agencies. Applicants must have a strong commitment to the intellectual, military, physical and ethical development of cadets, and be dedicated to excellence in teaching. Candidates must possess an exemplary military record to include command, significant leadership experience, completion of advanced military schooling (CSC minimum), and significant field experience. Applicants should have an impressive record of practical, applied research and publication in areas related to subjects taught by the Department of Systems Engineering and demonstrated excellence in education at the college-level, with teaching at USMA or a comparable level college/university being highly desirable. Candidates must hold a Ph.D. degree in any of the following areas (or a closely related discipline): Systems engineering, engineering management, operations research, simulation, industrial engineering, management/decision science, or have a master's degree with the ability to obtain the doctorate within three years of appointment. The selection committee will evaluate breadth and depth of military experience and specialties, evidence of leadership and vision, demonstrated teaching excellence and scholarly research, and personal attributes.
