



YORKTOWN AND VICINITY THE YORKTOWN CAMPAIGN

The Siege of Yorktown,
6 - 20 October 1781



French artillery firing from this line inflicted heavy damage on English shipping.

After the Battle of the Capes, 5-10 September, the French fleet blockaded Cornwallis in the Chesapeake.

Second Parallel opened night of 14-15 October.

Redoubts 9 & 10 stormed at bayonet point, 10 October.

First Parallel opened night of 6-7 October

Stueben, Lafayette and Lincoln alternated in command.
