



RATISBON AND VICINITY, 1809
DANUBE CAMPAIGNS
Situation Midnight, 21 - 22 April and
Movements Since 19 April 1809



The only vegetation shown is the Brixner Forest, because of its tactical importance.



This regiment holding the bridge at Ratisbon surrendered at 1800 20 April.

Charles gradually shifted his forces opposing Davout from west to east during the period 20-22 April. The exact traces of these moves are not shown.

Lefebvre's move from Abensberg to Eggmühl occurred after Lanne's attack to Landshut had cleared the East-West roads. Lanne's attack commenced at 0900 20 April and reached Landshut the evening of 21 April.

Lannes' Provisional Corps, formed on 19 - 20 April, consisted of two infantry divisions from Davout's corps plus two cavalry divisions --- a total strength of approximately 25,000. This change in task organization left Davout with 24,000 men under his command.
